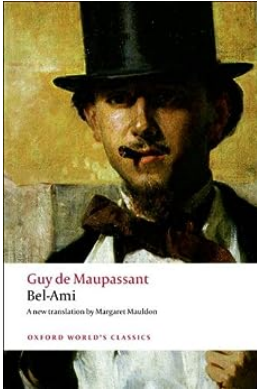

a devastating satire of the sleaziness of contemporary journalism.

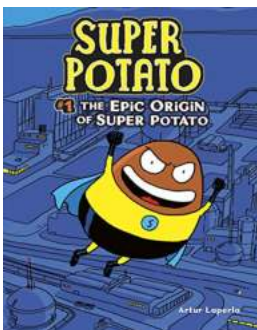
