

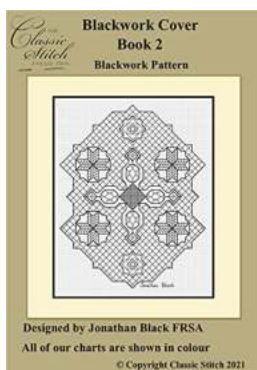

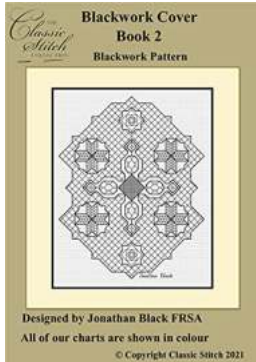

This picture has been stitched on 28 Count Zweigart canvass, however, it can be stitched on any count of canvass. This picture can be stitched using any colour thread, or any colour canvass. Please make sure that before stitching, that your chosen thread will show up on your chosen colour of canvass. To make this picture more personal colourful and unique, you could stitch it with several different colours, for different sections of the picture. Please make sure that they all go together first and that they will show up on the canvass once finished. Included is a full chart in colour together with a key and full instructions on how to complete each stitch, along with a short history of Blackwork Embroidery. The charts can be made bigger on your Kindle to help to see the symbols more clearly, with full instructions on how to work the stitches a beginner and a more experienced stitcher will be able to complete the finished picture. All that is

needed is time and patience.

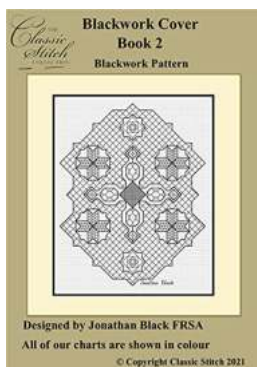
