

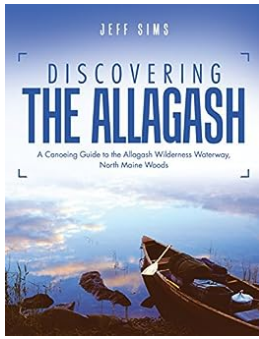

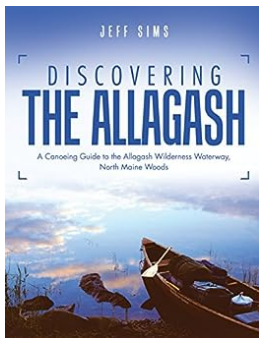

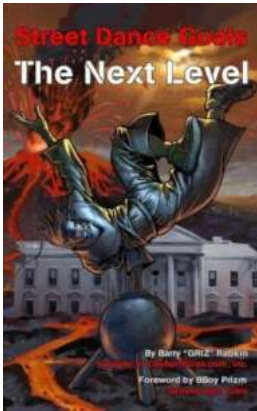

...in wildness is the preservation of the world.



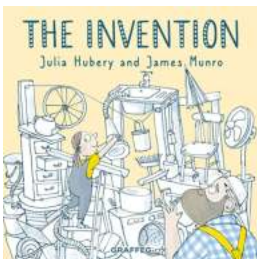
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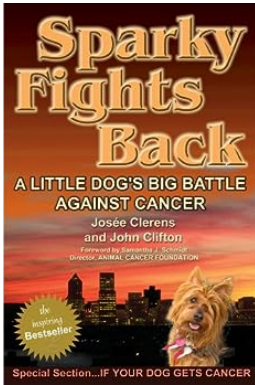
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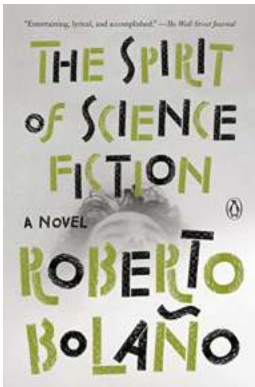
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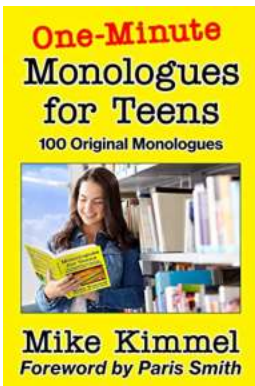
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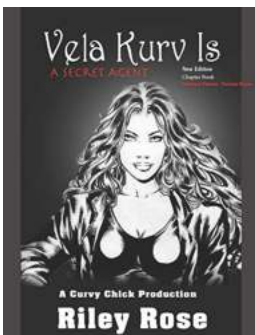
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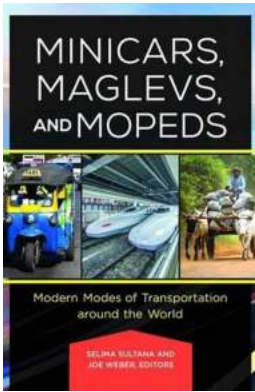
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
