bit closer to heaven. My thanks to those who want to explore something new while supporting an undiscovered author from Central Louisiana.



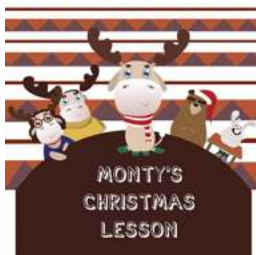

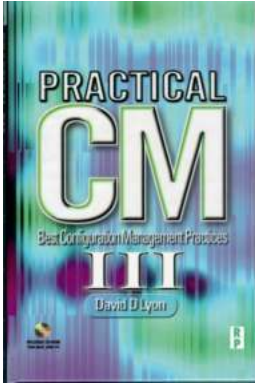

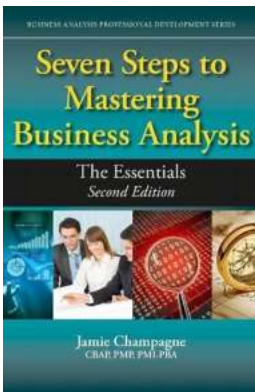
