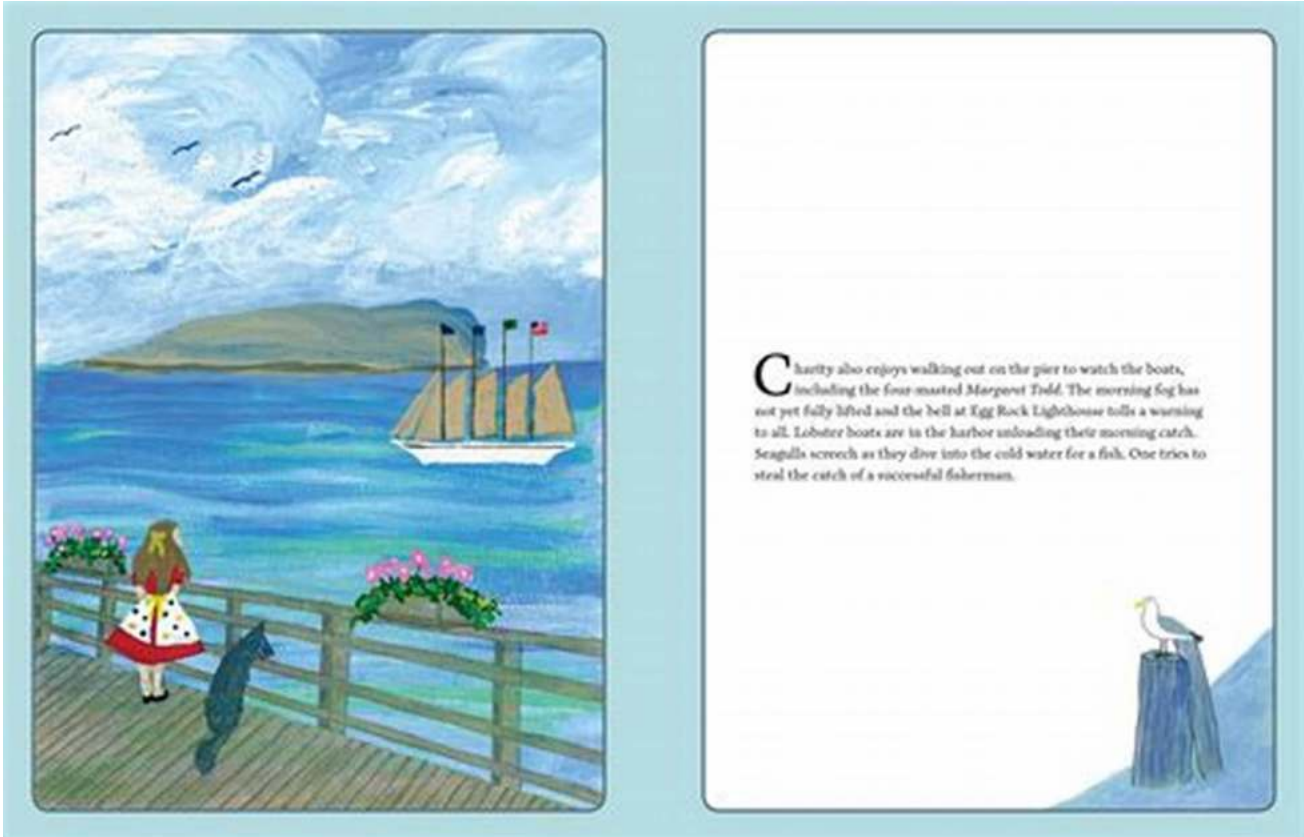
2. "A Song of Belonging" by Ana Popovic

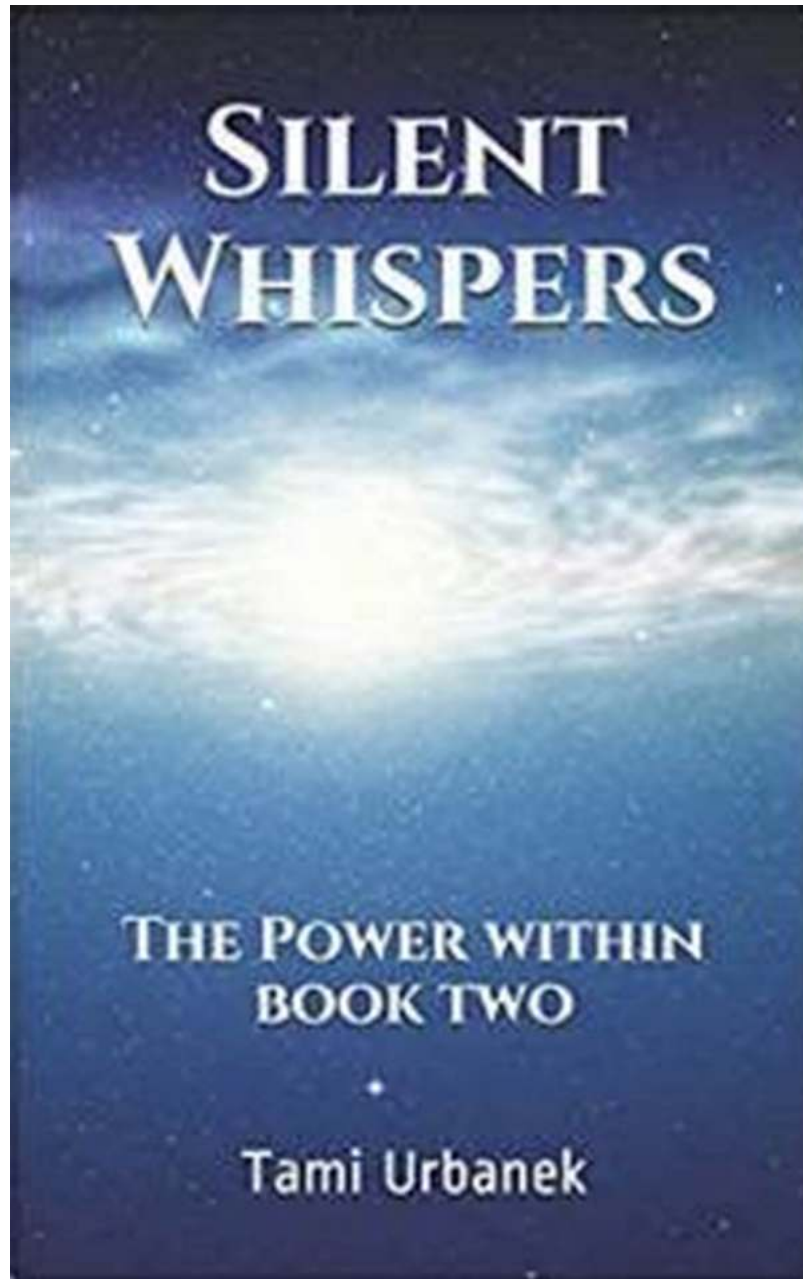
3. "The Forgotten Bridge" by Sofia Ivanova
