

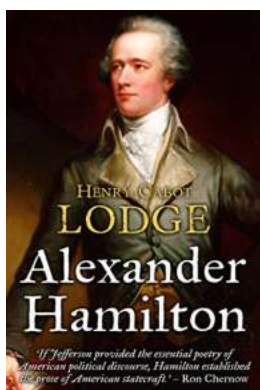

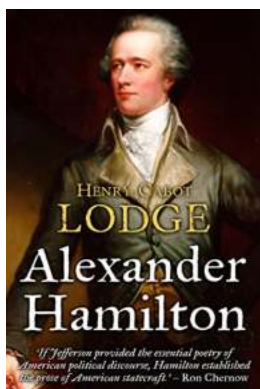

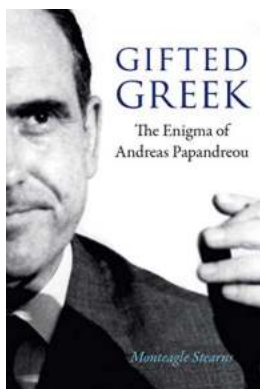
This biography presents the influence Alexander Hamilton had over the great historical advances of the United States of America.
