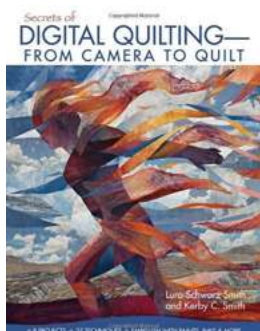
The lot of the United fan is not a happy one, but still they come, week in and week out, with their fervent chants of ‘Marching on Together’ and ‘Champions of

It is a story that simply must be read, whether you're a fan of the Whites or not.



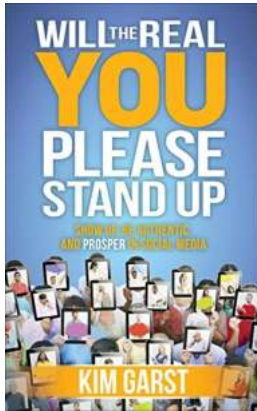
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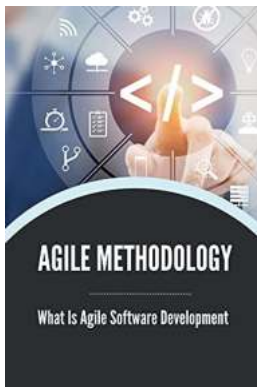
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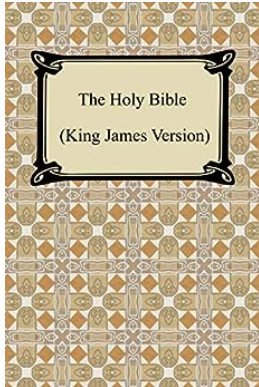
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## Declutter Your Home CHECKLIST
