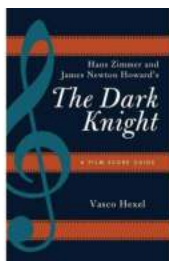
Drawing is fun. Do not be discouraged thinking that you should be able to draw everything imaginable from the beginning. It rarely works that way. We do not

Keep drawing. Practice daily and you will be well on your way to mastery in this most joyful journey of discovery.



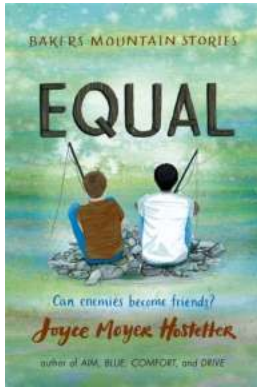

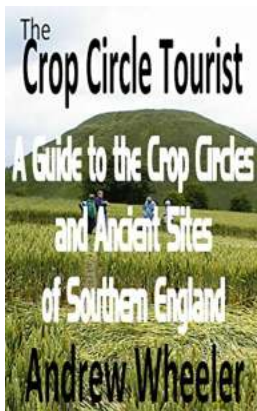
