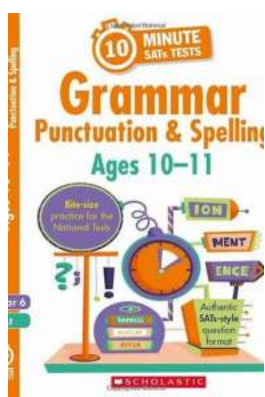

Comma ,	Commas are used to separate two or more nouns, to separate phrases or clauses or to separate direct speech.	Martin opened his bag, looked inside and said, "I have apples, pears and bananas."
