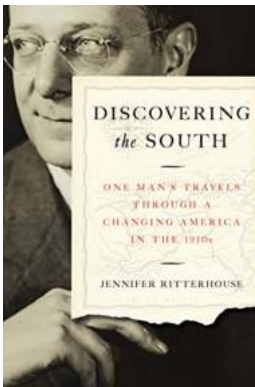
black and white southerners fighting for and against democratic social change at the start of the nation's long civil rights era.

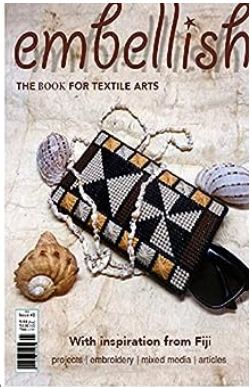

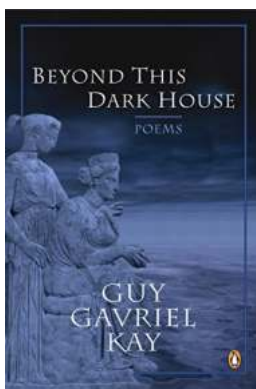

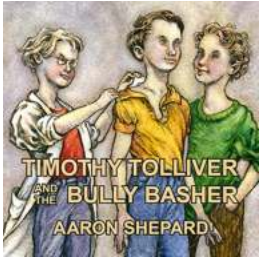
