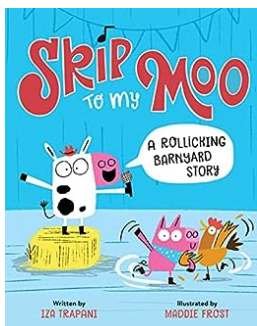


Skip To My Moo Rollicking Barnyard Story
