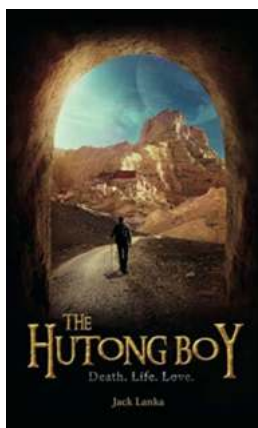
One can hardly imagine a more lucid description of the basic differences between Hamilton's Federalist and Jefferson's anti-Federalist faction than U.S. Senator Henry Cabot Lodge gives in his biography. If you slept through this part of U.S. History in high school and struggle to truly understand the subjects at issue, you would do well to read Lodge's explanation. 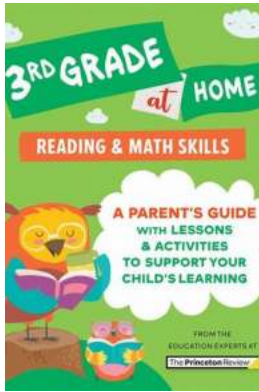

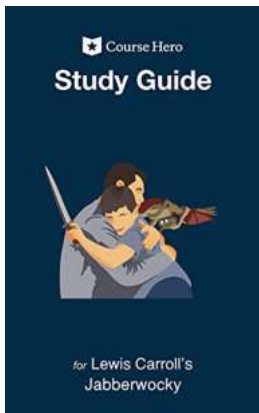

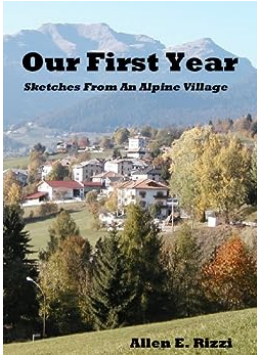
