Her American Career

Perhaps most remembered in the United States for her best-selling 1907 novel of exotic sensuality *Three Weeks* and her brainchild "It," that enigmatic characteristic embodied in actress Clara Bow and dramatized in the silent motion picture *It* (1927), English-born journalist, novelist, screenwriter, and actress Elinor Glyn, born Elinor Sutherland, embarked on her American career in 1920 during her second visit to the United States. Before that version materialized, however, Glyn returned to England, but only after lengthening her stay with a journey by rail through the American West to California.
