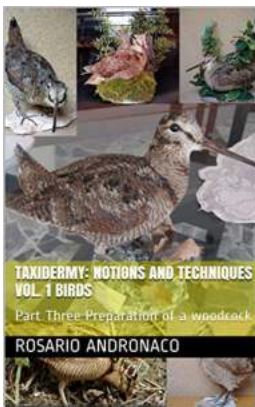

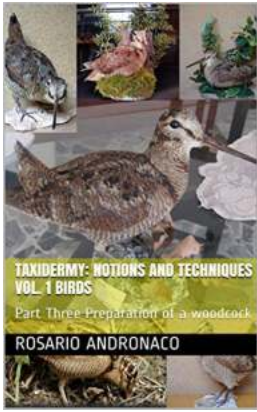

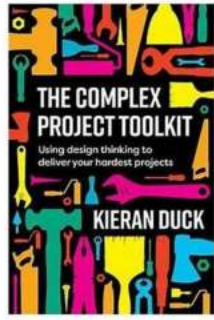
Through it and the updates that I will publish later, I will try to better describe an art, not unknown: taxidermy.

These first concepts therefore have the purpose of bringing as many people as possible to nature, no matter what means Nature itself will know how to be loved as it deserves and for what it is worth.

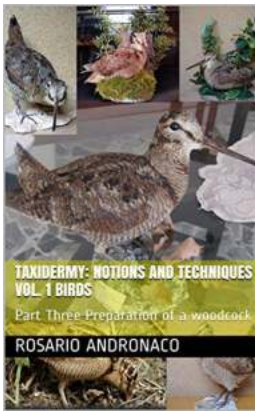
