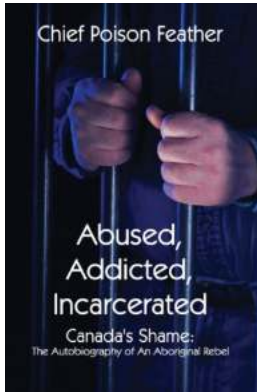

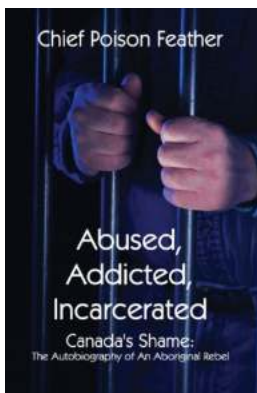

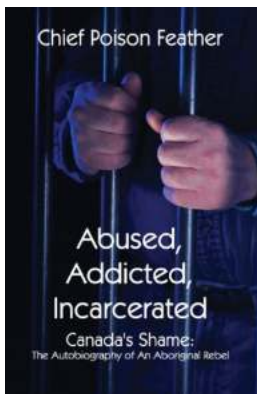

practices Native Spirituality. This is his story, a story of tragedy and forgiveness, and a final reconciliation with The Creator.



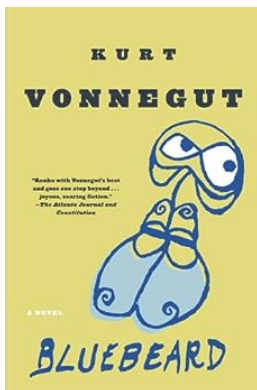

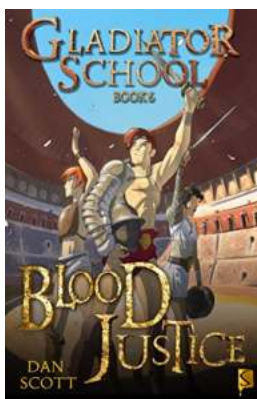

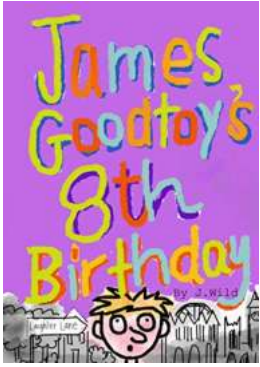
