he manipulated the selection of a new running mate, with an eye to a possible succession, displaying some of his old vigor and wit in a winning campaign.

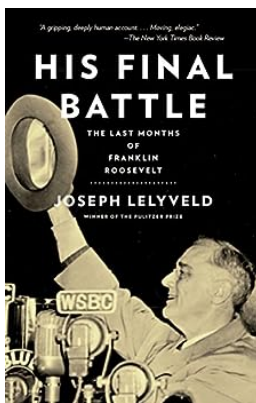

Lelyveld delivers an incisive portrait of this deliberately inscrutable man, a consummate leader to the very last.



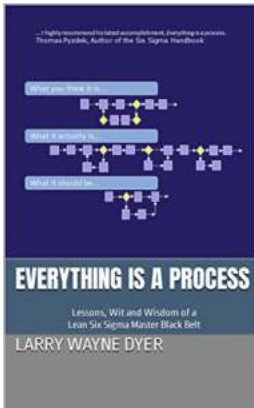

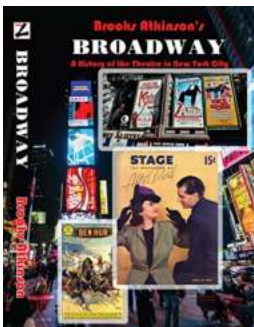

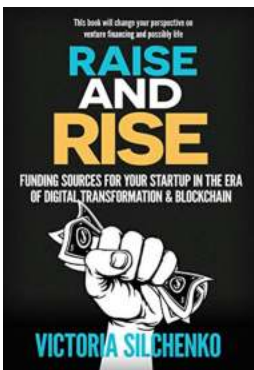
