

Getting Started with Whale Crochet Pattern

Rows 15-17: Sc in each stitch. (18 stitches)

Row 18: Decrease by making 2 sc together. (9 stitches)

Rows 19-20: Sc in each stitch. (9 stitches)

Fasten off and leave a long tail for sewing.

Step 2: Fin

With light blue yarn:

Row 1: Create a magic ring and 6 sc stitches into it. (6 stitches)

Rows 2-4: Sc in each stitch. (6 stitches)

Fasten off and leave a long tail for sewing.

Sew the fin onto the back of the whale body.

Step 3: Tail

With light blue yarn:

Row 1: Create a magic ring and 4 sc stitches into it. (4 stitches)

Rows 2-4: Sc in each stitch. (4 stitches)

Fasten off and leave a long tail for sewing.

Sew the tail onto the bottom of the whale body.

Step 4: Eyes

Attach safety eyes or sew black beads onto the whale's face. You can position them however you like to give your amigurumi its own unique expression. If you prefer, you can also embroider the eyes using black yarn.

Step 5: Mouth

Using white yarn, sew a small smiling mouth onto the whale's face. This will give your amigurumi a friendly and cute look.

Step 6: Filling and Assembly

Stuff the whale body firmly with stuffing material. Make sure to stuff the tail and fin as well to give them shape. Once you're satisfied with the stuffing, sew the opening closed using the long tail left at the end of the body row.

Step 7: The Final Touches


